

COVID-19 Risk Assessment Management - Clubhouse External Areas

The risk from COVID-19 appears to be less high risk outside so if the weather is good, customers should be encouraged to drink outside.

PEOPLE EXPOSED

HAZARDS

- Spreading the virus to staff and to the wider public community**
If no controls are put in place the outside area could increase the risk of passing on to others the virus
- Slips trips and falls**
With more people in the outside area the risk of slips and trips will increase
- Dealing with adverse weather**
The site needs to consider how it is going to deal with people in the garden if it suddenly starts raining

CONTROL MEASURES

- Moving tables to maintain social distance**
Tables in the outside area to be arranged to allow for social distancing
- Social Distancing**
Those using the outside area should maintain the social distancing protocol of 2m unless seated where statutory recommendation should be implemented.
- Hand hygiene**
Sanitiser stations are at the entrance to the club and hand sanitiser must be used if customers wish to re - access the outside area via the club room fire doors as there is a one way system in place
- Smoking**
No smoking is allowed in front or to the side of the entrance or exit to the clubhouse
- Adverse Weather**
Use of the outside area is not allowed in adverse weather as there cannot be a sudden influx of people into the club due to the weather deteriorating

□ **Protecting staff**

The same principles that apply inside apply externally and the same serving techniques will be applied

□ **Manage the numbers within the outside area**

Monitoring to take place so that the number of customers allowed to drink outside does not in any way compromise the maximum occupancy of 35 social distancing requirements inside the clubhouse should adverse weather arrive.
